## Planned Expenditure for PE Premium 2022/23 - with REVIEW

Schools must use the funding PE Premium funding provided by the government to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that they offer. The following five indicators will demonstrate the improvements that have been made due to the premium:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
